NHSN COVID-19 Vaccination Module

5/11/21, CMS: NHs must report COVID-19 vaccine coverage of staff and residents WEEKLY to NHSN.

- CMS will post these data on <u>CMS's COVID-19</u> <u>Nursing Home Data website</u>.
- 6/13/21: Enforcement of reporting begins

Testing Requirement Updates (as of 5/19/21)

State Testing Requirement (weekly testing) will end MAY 31, 2021.

- Nursing homes <u>required</u> to follow CMS requirements for routine screening and outbreak testing after May 31, 2021.
- Assisted Living
 - Memory care units: DPH <u>recommends</u> following CDC guidance/CMS requirements for nursing homes after May 31, 2021
 - Non-memory care units: no recommendation for non-outbreak testing.

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




It is NOT recommended to test anyone recovered from SARS-CoV-2 infection in the last 90 days who remains asymptomatic

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Outbreak Testing in Assisted Living

Memory care units in AL should generally follow NH guidance.

- What type of unit has staff/resident case(s)?
 - If a staff member was in a memory care unit during their infectious period (or a resident in memory care is positive), we recommend everyone (staff and residents) in the memory care unit get tested, regardless of vaccination status.
 - If not in the memory care unit, then anyone who came in close contact with the person with COVID-19 should get tested, regardless of vaccination status.
- Anyone with an exposure, regardless of vaccination status, should have 2
 COVID-19 tests: 1 immediately, and another 5-7 days after exposure

Anyone with SARS-CoV-2 <u>infection in the last 90 days</u> do not need to be tested if they remain asymptomatic, including those with a known contact.

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Updated ALSA Reporting Requirements: COVID-19 case reporting to LTC-MAP (as of May 20, 2021)

- NO MORE DAILY REPORTING if no new cases
- NEW: Report COVID-19 cases among staff and residents within 24 hours of detection. Report all new cases detected since prior report.
- NEW: <u>ALL ALSAs to report weekly case summaries</u>
 - INCLUDES ALSAs with all zeroes case counts.
 - Reporting time period is Wed-Tues
 - Report each WEDNESDAY by 10AM.
- No more Friday vaccine questions.

ALSAs: Answer these questions in LTC-MAP weekly, on Wednesdays by 10am.
