





Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program

- + Prior to a Disaster
- Discuss facility's emergency operations plan (EOP) with a representative from the Ombudsman Program
- + Responding to a Disaster
- + Notify the Ombudsman Program of the incident
- + Representatives may visit evacuated residents to provide assistance

Evacuation Plan

- + Pre-determined evacuation locations
- + "Like" facility = Categories of Care
- + 10 identified for each member in MassMAP
- + At least one is 50 miles away (CMS)
- + Evacuation routes, maps and times
- + Google maps links







